### **NanoBioMagnetics Receives Export Award From US Department of Commerce**

Edmond, OK (April 26, 2010): Officials at NanoBioMagnetics, Inc (NBMI) announced recently that the company was awarded an Export Achievement Certificate by the U.S. Department of Commerce at the organization's 2010 Oklahoma World Trade Conference, held April 14 in Tulsa, OK. The award, which was created to recognize small and medium sized enterprises that have successfully entered the international marketplace for the first time or that have successfully entered a new market, was accepted by NBMI Founder and CEO, Charles Seeney.



The conference program focused on presentations and panel discussions regarding ways to increase a company's competitive position in an ever-changing and expanding global economy. The highlight of the luncheon session was the

presentation of the 2010 Governor's Award for Excellence in Exporting and the Export Achievement Awards. The annual event highlighted World Trade Month as proclaimed by the President of the United States, with expert speakers and local business leaders discussing topics on improving export capabilities.

"As a young company, just entering the international arena, this is certainly an honor", says Seeney. He notes that the international marketplace can be filled with "potholes", and learning from other's experiences can be an invaluable resource.

The Citation noted that, in 2009, NBMI entered into a technology transfer agreement with the non-profit Institute of Innovation and Technology Transfer, Monterrey City, Mexico, in which NBMI installed their nanofabrication platform in the Institute's newly established Nanotechnology Incubator. Clients of the Incubator will have access to various nanofabrication platforms for product development and commercialization, and, in 2010, NBMI entered into a cross-licensing agreement with nanoTherics (NT), Stoke-on-Trent (UK), with the company's magnetic vectoring platform, which opens commercialization opportunities in geographic regions for both organizations.

The awards were presented by Ronald Wilson, USEAC Director, and Charles Mills, Chairman, Oklahoma District Export Council. Seeney adds in concluding, "Perhaps next year we will win the Governor's award."
